

"Shame resides in the primal, existential part of us that is unutterable in its intensity. It expresses itself at times in the simple but tortured cry from the heart: Not good enough! It is a truly desperate disease of the soul... If the story of Jesus is told in terms of the one who deliberately, intentionally, purposefully seeks out all those who have been shamed - as well as those who have been the instigators of shame – then the narrative takes on a far deeper, more personal, more transforming hue. It is that Christ who not only understands our shamed condition but who has himself entered into the depths of shame for us.
